As The Hazel A. Hare president & CEO of Arizona Science Center, Chevy Humphrey oversees the \$12 million operation of the 164,000-square-foot facility with more than 330 employees and volunteers. Each year, more than 500,000 visitors, including 167,000 Arizona schoolchildren, visit Arizona Science Center.

Outside of her work at the Science Center, Humphrey serves on the board of Grand Canyon Education, GCE is a shared services partner dedicated to serving colleges and universities. Humphrey is a committed leader and advocate for global, national, local, and statewide education initiatives, serving on the boards of the Sandra Day O'Connor Institute, College Success Arizona, and Downtown Phoenix Partnership. Additionally, she is the past board chair of the Association of Science-Technology Centers (ASTC), an international organization dedicated to furthering the public understanding of science among increasingly diverse audiences, ASTC has more than 600 science center and museum members in more than 40 countries worldwide. She is also the current vice-chair of the American Alliance of Museums, a leader in developing best practices and advocating for museums to more than 35,000 individual museum professionals and volunteers, institutions, and corporate partners globally.
